Today's scripture reminds us that there is a greater cause to play for, and we need to encourage others to compete for the souls of those around us. Being steadfast means working with unshakable determination. God rarely, if ever, asks us to do anything that doesn't require us to give it everything we've got. However, he is faithful in supporting us if we walk in obedience. Every day is a test, and if we choose to walk with the Lord, we can remain steadfast and blessed under trial.

I encourage you to spend more time studying God's Word with unshakable determination and see how blessed your life will be.

The next time someone asks you "what are we playing for?" Try saying "The crown of life" and see their reaction. Maybe they'll ask you what you mean by that, and it will open the door to a great conversation that they need to have and allow you to share the good news—just a thought.
